#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

FRANKSTON RURAL WSC has violated the monitoring and reporting requirements set by Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) in Chapter 30, Section 290, Subchapter F. Even though these were not emergencies, as our customers, you have the right to know what happened and what we are doing (or did) to correct these situations.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During 03/31/2014; 01/01/2015-12/31/2015; 01/01/2016-06/30/2016; 07/01/2016-12/31/2016; 01/01/2017-06/30/201; 07/01/2017-12/30/2017 we did not monitor for Lead and copper and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water during that time.
